

## Husker Kellen Huston Suspended This Weekend; Missouri Fan Files Charges

Nebraska football player Kellen Huston has been suspended for one game by Head Coach Frank Solich after he hit a Missouri fan who charged the field after last Saturday's game.

After reviewing film of the incident and talking with witnesses, Solich said Tuesday that he believes Huston was simply reacting to what he saw as a dangerous situation but the team does not condone its players striking another person.

Huston, the team's place-kick holder, will not be playing in the Texas A & M game on Saturday.

After practice Tuesday, Huston apologized for the incident.

Huston said, *"I sincerely regret what transpired Saturday evening in Columbia, Missouri. My actions should not be a reflection on Coach Solich, the University of Nebraska or*

## "Property Taxes to Rise"

The taxing entities in Lancaster County may have tried to lower the tax rate for the budget year...but increased property valuations more than offset any savings. The County Assessor's Office will be mailing out property tax statements beginning next month and most homeowners will find an increased tax bill. The actual tax rate fell about one-third of a cent per 100-dollars in valuation, but average property values rose 14 percent. Factoring out new construction, the average valuation rose 10 percent. That means the owner of a 75-thousand dollar home will see a tax increase of about 150 dollars.

Omaha State Senator Ernie Chambers wants a Sarpy County District Judge sanctioned because of a ruling made in a child visitation case. Judge Ronald Reagan ruled in a September hearing that a non-custodial Hispanic man must speak only English to his five-year-old

University of Missouri police say 21-year-old Matthew Scott of Lees Summit, Missouri, claims he was punched by a Husker player on Faurot Field after the Tigers upset Nebraska, 41-to-24.

Campus Police Chief Jack Watring says the fan came forward Tuesday morning asking that the player be charged with assault.

He suffered two black eyes and a swollen nose in the incident.

No word yet if the fan will face charges of trespassing, a charge that many of Scott's fellow students were hit with after running on the field despite repeated warnings not to.
